Winter Home Maintenance Checklist

I. Roof & Gutters	
	[] Inspect roof for loose, missing, or curled shingles
	[] Check flashing around vents and chimneys
	[] Clean gutters and downspouts
	[] Ensure downspouts drain at least 5 ft from foundation
	[] Install gutter guards (optional)
	[] Remove heavy snow from roof after storms (use roof rake)
2. [Doors, Windows & Insulation
	[] Check for drafts around windows and doors
	[] Apply weatherstripping or caulk gaps
	[] Install storm windows or window film
	[] Add door sweeps to prevent heat loss
	[] Insulate attic access hatch
	[] Seal gaps around pipes, vents, and electrical openings
3. F	Plumbing & Pipes
	[] Insulate exposed pipes (basement, crawl space, garage)
	[] Disconnect and drain outdoor hoses
	[] Shut off exterior faucets; install insulated covers
	[] Let indoor faucets drip during extreme cold
	[] Keep home thermostat at least 55 F (even when away)
	[] Know where your main water shut-off valve is
4. Heating System & Fireplace	
	[] Schedule professional HVAC inspection
	[] Replace or clean air filters monthly
	[] Check thermostat batteries
	[] Clean and inspect chimney or flue
	[] Stock up on firewood (if applicable)

[] Test carbon monoxide and smoke detectors

5. Yard & Exterior	
[] Trim tree branches near roof or power lines	
[] Rake and clear debris around the foundation	
[] Seal cracks in driveway and walkways	
[] Store patio furniture and garden tools	
[] Cover outdoor grills and A/C units	
[] Drain and store sprinklers or irrigation hoses	
6. Power Outage Prep	
[] Test generator and check fuel supply	
[] Stock flashlights and fresh batteries	
[] Keep portable chargers ready	
[] Store bottled water and nonperishable food	
[] Have blankets and warm clothes accessible	
[] Keep snow shovels, salt, and sand handy	
7. Safety & Miscellaneous	
[] Review home insurance coverage	
[] Check attic and basement for leaks or dampness	
[] Test sump pump	
[] Replace worn weather seals on garage doors	
[] Ensure emergency contacts are updated	
[] Make a list of local contractors (plumber, roofer, electrician)
